One of the cornerstones of our life together as The Dennis Union Church is worship, but it has to be good worship, worship that gives glory to God and makes the word of God clear to the worshippers in the pews and the choir loft. Slowly but surely, working with the Worship Planning Team and the Deacons, I have been tweaking the Sunday morning worship services.

Have you noticed that all the elements of the worship service fit nicely together like the pieces of a jigsaw puzzle? There is a theme to each service, and that theme is captured in the scriptures, the sermon, the Word for the Young, the hymns, the anthems, the pastoral prayer, and the call to worship. Margaret Bossi, Bette Anne Crowell, Barbara Wells, and Cindy Fiscus help me to develop the theme. Sermons are planned well in advance so that they can be thinking about the anthems, the hymns, and the children's sermon for several weeks. Sometimes my preaching follows the lectionary, a prescribed list of scriptures used by many churches, but I also preach on timely topics that I hope will speak to the congregation. <u>Caution:</u> As we get to know each other better, I will begin to include a "congregation participation" sermon into the mix every now and then.

I consider the prelude and the postlude to be very much a part of the worship service. Both are an offering to God. They are not "traveling music" or entertainment. I understand that some folks feel they cannot sit through the postlude. You may, if you wish, leave quietly during the postlude, though that seems a bit awkward to me. Would you leave in the middle of a sermon or during the pastoral prayer? The postlude does not need to be applauded. It is worship, not a recital. After the postlude, feel free to speak with friends as you leave the worship service.

From my view in the pulpit, I see a few folks checking their watches during worship. Nobody keeps an eye on the clock more than I do. I try very hard to make sure that worship only lasts an hour, even if it means having to put my sermon into "overdrive." On communion Sundays, it is not easy to keep the service within an hour, but we will try. I am making some subtle changes to the communion service in the hopes of making it run more smoothly. The retired pastors, who are very much a part of our church family, are helping me to review these changes.

Please know that worship is very, very important to me. I welcome your suggestions, concerns, and criticisms.


If you would like to be more involved on Sunday mornings we have three opportunities for you:

Plans for our kitchen rebuild are progressing and will be going out for bid soon.

Renovations on the Faith Neighborhood Kitchen will start in mid-April. A chef will be hired to oversee meal planning and preparation. Our volunteers will help prepare and serve meals at the newly renovated facility. No more schlepping of large pots of food from DUC to Faith Neighborhood Kitchen in Hyannis, where in the past 4 years, 96,000 meals have been served!!

Council agreed it is time to replace our 5-year-old DUC photo directory. Karen and Cal Mutti have volunteered to head up this effort in honor of our 150th Anniversary, and as a gift for a new settled pastor.
