Though my handwriting has been classified as barely legible "chicken scratch", and my signature is often mistaken for that of a physician signing a prescription blank, I enjoy writing notes, especially "thank you" notes. At the beginning of Lent, I enjoyed writing "thank you"

notes to everyone who made a financial commitment to The Dennis Union Church for 2016.

Though I tried to make each note unique, I discovered that there were certain phrases that kept popping up in my writing. In each note, I used the word "faithfulness." There are a variety of ways to be faithful, including supporting the mission and ministry of the church. We do that with our pledges. We do that by rolling up our sleeves and pitching in, even if we are not too talented, and our time is quite limited. We do that when we invite others to come to church with us and demonstrate that we are a church of extravagant welcome!

I found that in many of my notes, I wrote about how much I have been enjoying my ministry in Dennis, and I described The Dennis Union Church as "a strong, healthy church poised for growth." That really is true! Dennis Union is strong! It is healthy! It is poised for growth!

One sign of our growth is that we received 13 new members into the church on March 13th, and several others, who could not be present on the 13th, have asked when the next opportunity would be to join? (mid-June)

Though I've only been with you for three months, I see other positive signs that indicate that the church is poised for growth.

- There is great energy within the church. The power of the Holy Spirit is at work in our midst.
- The Dennis Union Church is a generous, caring church. I'm impressed with the ways that the church reaches out to others. Mission is an important part of ministry.
- The Dennis Union Church is a "happy church." There is little, if any, complaining or conflict. That is unusual for a church.
- The members of the church are open to change. There is a genuine interest in discovering what God is calling us to be and do, and what it might mean for us, as a church, to "live in the deep water."

I'm looking forward to reading the notes from the "cottage meetings" organized by the Visioning Committee. I'm looking forward to the 150th anniversary celebration. I'm looking forward to seeing where God is leading us.

In Mid-February we were visited by a vacationing pastor and her husband. She was so impressed with the welcome they received that she wrote the following for her March church newsletter:

As Jim and I entered the church building in Dennis that morning, we were warmly greeted by 2 men at the door acting as ushers. I was impressed because they asked us our names and introduced themselves, also asking where we were from. What happened next was wonderful- each person took us to someone else and introduced us to other church members. We were enthusiastically welcomed over and over. In their conversations they sought to learn more about us and connect us with others with whom we might have some common interest or experience. They were genuine in their welcome— despite their knowledge that we did not live there. It was obvious that they loved their church and they wanted to make us feel like welcome guests. One of their members and her husband even came to sit with us. We felt like honored guests with the red carpet rolled out. As we left that Sunday, several folks urged us to come back again. I want to go back- it felt so good to share worship with them that day.

Hands of Hope Outreach Center: For over twenty-five years, HANDS OF HOPE OUTREACH CENTER has provided critical emergency assistance to low-income families in need in the mid-Cape area (Mashpee to Harwich), offering emergency food, financial assistance to prevent evictions and homelessness, emergency sheltering, assistance with utility and medical bills, clothing, and small household goods. On the first Sunday of each month, Communion Sunday, we encourage our congregation to bring in NON-PERISHABLE food items for our collection basket. We make sure the items get to Hands of Hope.

A Baby Center: Founded in 2000, A BABY CENTER, provides critical basic baby needs to income eligible families (WIC) for infants up to age three, on Cape Cod and the Islands. Approximately 525 babies are served every month. A new component, Child-Safe Car Seats, ensures infants and children are safely transported in vehicles. Diapers and baby wipes are always an urgent need. Please bring these items to church whenever possible, and we will make sure they get to ABC. Also, gently used baby clothing is also accepted. They do not accept toys or stuffed animals at this time.



HOMELESS MINISTRIES: After providing sheltering in churches for over a decade, in 2013 Overnights of Hospitality transitioned into Hospitality Housing, a housing-based program. 'Overnights' men and women are now living in transitional housing, receiving on-going case management services and working towards their goals including permanent housing. Financial assistance through Lydia's Gifts for women and our Emergency Housing Fund helps cover community fees and rents when needed. Church volunteers, coordinated by the Homeless Ministries Volunteer Coordinator, remain a key component of the Homeless Ministries program. At Dennis Union, we have assisted women and men transitioning into new housing by donating household items, when needed. From time to time, emails are sent to all churches on the Cape looking for drivers to help residents get to appointments. Social Concerns Committee notifies congregation when assistance is needed.

<u>Days of Hospitality</u> ~ Individuals sign-up at Salvation Army to partake of weekend lunches at Cape churches. Our church prepares a Sunday lunch for the 4th Sunday every-other-month. We normally prepare enough food to feed about 25-30 people. Social Concerns is thankful for all the cooks, and also the drivers needed to transport the guests from Hyannis to church - and back again. If you would like to drive our guests or provide a food item, notices of reminder are posted in the weekly bulletins and in our weekly emailing.

Faith Neighborhood Kitchen ~ The FNK is a consortium of churches which picked up the Monday-Wednesday-Friday dinners formerly provided by Calvary Baptist Church until fire destroyed their church in March 2012. Since April 2012, the consortium has cooked and carried meals to Faith Assembly of God Church, 154 Bearses Way, Hyannis. Dennis Union Church cooks on the 1st Friday of every month. We require cooks, helpers, and people to serve the meal. A huge blessing has been all the people from our church that provide all the "extras"; the salad ingredients, fruit, bread, and drinks. Five members from D.U.C. became ServSafe eligible to prepare meals. If you would like to cook the main entree for 150 people, help prep the meal, or serve the meal, please ask. Reminders are posted in the weekly bulletin and emailing.

On-Site Salvation Army lunches ~ this mission almost has a life of its own, under the capable direction of Gayle Williams. Gayle and her crew prepare a lunch at Salvation Army on the 4th Monday of each month. If you would like to assist Gayle's team, or provide a dessert, please call 362-9746.

ELIZABETH!

For the next several months, the CE will be following Elizabeth Egan's travels to South Africa. We were able to assist Elizabeth with her travel expenses thanks to a generous gift the CE received a few years ago. Elizabeth is a student at Merrimack College and is a member of Dennis Union through Confirmation. What you will read below is **week 3 and 4** of her mission trip. Stay tuned – more in May!

Weeks 3 and 4: I will move in with a different host family within a township in Cape Town. Townships are considered to be the "slums" or "ghettos". Here I will be working on building Eco-friendly homes for the residents of the township, as well as a community center, and a large sports field for the children to play on. I will also receive physical education lessons on which I will be able to volunteer in teaching those classes as well.

Phys-Ed curriculums have been cut from the school systems throughout the continent of Africa because they can barely afford to teach their students to read, write, and have basic math skills. Therefore, teaching physical education becomes a volunteer effort. The building itself will take place in the mornings, as it will be too hot to do such work in the afternoons. My afternoons will be spent volunteering as a physical education teacher during the week days, helping to organize and participate in community events on the weekends, and helping to feed the residents of the township dinner throughout my 2 weeks on this particular project.
